The young fish, which were raised by Casa Grande High School Students/United Anglers of Casa Grande Hatchery on Adobe Creek in Petaluma, were taken to the salmon-rearing pens at the Romberg Tiburon Center for Environmental Studies. They will be kept there under a program coordinated by the San Francisco Tye Foundation, Blackie's Student Brigade and the Tiburon Salmon Institute until they are released into the bay in October, according to Brooke Halsey, Jr. Of the Tye Foundation.
